

## Council Tax Taxbase

Can you please detail any changes to the taxbase of every local authority as a result of the revaluation/ rebanding exercise, including any annual changes during the period of the transitional relief scheme.

The table below shows the number of council tax dwellings per local authority which made up the taxbase for 2004/5 and 2005/6. It also shows the percentage change between the two years. In years prior to revaluation the percentage change was generally around 1% year on year.

The Transitional Relief Scheme has no impact on the taxbase because it is a scheme whereby the Welsh Assembly Government provides money for individual council tax payers through the local authority.
